The Old Course

Currently ranked number 19 in Australia. With spectacular views over Mornington Peninsula and Bass Strait, The Old Course offers a standout experience.

ABOUT THE COURSE

Designed by Robert Trent Jones Jnr, The Old Course is a dramatic layout constructed on undulating terrain, with fairways weaving between and over large sand dunes, bordered by tea tree and rich native coastal vegetation. Boasting a wealth of exciting shots, perhaps most notably the short par-3 seventh, fused with boldly undulating greens, deceptively wide fairways and striking bunkering, The Old Course remains one of the premier golfing experiences in Australia, and amongst the most memorable anywhere in the world.

Set within the glorious Cups Country, the
Moonah course offers a rugged, natural and
more modern-style layout.

ABOUT THE COURSE

Taking its name from the ancient indigenous coastal Moonah trees scattered throughout the property, Moonah calls for strong tee shots and intelligent play, offering hole after hole of challenge and interesting golf. Featuring open fairways and towering dunes, the par-5s here are a standout feature, rewarding bold, accurate play throughout. The greens, meanwhile, give a superior set of natural putting surfaces, inspired in location, and boasting variety and artistry. By far one of the most enjoyable walks in Australian golf, and one of the nation's very best courses.

Gunnamatta

TOM DOAK

Currently ranked number 8 in Australia.

Acclaimed course architect Tom Doak recently redesigned the former Ocean course to produce an interesting, dramatic and strategic layout.

ABOUT THE COURSE

Situated by the thundering whitewash of Gunnamatta Beach, Doak embraced the natural 'cup' and 'bowl' undulations of the region's sandy terrain, delivering generous fairways, natural bunkering, and imaginative green shapes with excellent ground contours for ample creativity near the hole. Boasting an array of excellent short par fours, few courses manage to pack as much stimulation, playability and enjoyment into 18 holes as this one.

Long Island


GORDON OLIVER

ABOUT THE COURSE

Long Island is considered by many to be a hidden gem amongst Melbourne's hallowed golfing landscapes. With a mix of tea-tree and majestic gum tree lined couch fairways the course has a great variety of well-designed holes requiring skill and strategy to navigate. The immaculately presented greens demand precise play.

Membership Classes



CLASS A A private share with family membership rights where the shareholder may nominate their spouse and also children or grandchildren up to the age of 29 years, for membership of the Club.

CLASS B A corporate share with family membership rights. The Company may nominate three people for membership who each may nominate their spouse and also children or grandchildren up to the age of 29 years, for membership of the Club.

C L A S S

A private share where the shareholder may also nominate their children or grandchildren up to the age of 29 years*, for membership of the Club.

CLASS D A corporate share where the Company may nominate three people for membership who each may also nominate their children or grandchildren up to the age of 29 years*, for membership of the Club.

CLASS E A private share for two family members with no annual subscription in perpetuity and also the right to nominate their children or grandchildren up to the age of 29 years*, for membership of the Club.

CLASS F A corporate share for two nominees with no annual subscription in perpetuity and also the right to nominate their children or grandchildren up to the age of 29 years*, for membership of the Club.

^{*}The Club Rules only permit a maximum number of 100 junior nominee members (up to the age of 29 years) at any one time.
